Chelsea FC & FJS Partnership Events

On Tuesday 5th June Chelsea FC will be running a Primary Teaching Award course for teachers from across the region here at Frogmore. We continue to work in close partnership with Chelsea FC and are pleased that our school is able to provide support for pupils and staff through our work together.

On Thursday 7th June Chelsea FC, in partnership with the San Francisco 49ers, will be running another training event for teachers, looking at how youth or 'flag' American Football is played at school level. It is similar to 'tag rugby' – if you have a particular interest in American Football do let me know as there may be opportunities to get involved with this programme in the future.

Hockey

Our Y5/6 Hockey team are in action on Thursday 7th June in the inter-schools fixtures taking place at Samuel Cody. They are also playing as part of a hockey festival on Thursday 21st June at Yateley Hockey Club, so a busy time for our hockey players.

School Council

Each week our School Council meets and we make sure that the children's voices are heard. We run class meetings on Wednesday mornings and we share the outcomes through our councillors each Friday. There are two elections throughout the year – one at the start of the autumn term in September and another after the February half term. We have seen some impressive outcomes this year so we are looking forward to sharing news of our

approach and the work that our pupils have been doing at a Trust 'Pupil Voice' conference on Wednesday 13th June. We will be taking a group of pupils to represent our school and I will be very proud to hear what they have to say.

We have also been invited to speak at the Nelson Mandela Centenary Conference in Winchester. Taking place on September 5th, we will take a small group of children – I am sure it will be a fantastic experience for them.

Did you know that we are introducing a 'fruit tuck shop' after half term from an idea that started in School Council? Our playground storage, celebration assembly and behaviour rewards/sanctions have all been shaped by the views of the council. 'Bags2School' helped to support the homeless (Sustainable Goal 1 – zero poverty) and reusable beakers have been introduced at lunchtimes instead of throw-away plastic cups to help towards Sustainable Goal 12 (Responsible consumption and production), again, all from ideas that the children came up with.

As the half-term break is here, we asked School Council (who asked children in their classes) for suggestions about what to do. They came up with the following list:

This is completely **optional** and is just a suggestion for an alternative holiday activity. Enjoy!


