Ofsted Report

It is such great news for the school and our local area. I'm particularly proud of the 'outstanding' judgement for pupil behaviour as this reflects the day-to-day reality of life in school. I am also proud of how our pupils are noted to have such positive attitudes to school. I am so pleased that Ofsted recognise that we aim for the highest possible standards for all our pupils – it really shows how hard everyone is working.

Ofsted noted:

'a broad curriculum that is brought to life through carefully planned visits, visitors and first-hand experiences

a wide range of sporting opportunities and a 'have a go' environment that encourages pupils to learn from their mistakes.'

Recent test results also received praise, with Ofsted commenting on how pupils achieve above average results in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. Pupils from disadvantaged backgrounds do particularly well and pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities make good progress.

Ofsted stated: 'The recent rise in standards, together with pupils' positive attitudes to learning, ensures that pupils are prepared well for secondary school.'

It is a team effort – staff, pupils, parents, governors, the Academy Trust: it is a report for all of us. Well done everyone!

School Games Gold Mark

Frogmore has just been awarded the 'Gold' Mark in recognition of excellence in Primary School Sport. We are the only school to gain this award, in the region, this year. The award scheme launched in 2012 and is facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community.

Frogmore sporting achievements include success in:

Football, Hockey, Handball, Judo, Running, Athletics, Futsal, Gymnastics, Rugby and more.

We are extremely proud of our pupils for their dedication to all aspects of school sport, including those young volunteers, leaders and officials who made our competitions possible. Whether it's School Games 'Gold' or a 'Good' Ofsted report, we need to thank the Academy Trust, Governors and the whole staff team for their tireless efforts and commitment to the school. Special thanks to Ms Mohi for her efforts in pushing school games and PE to 'Gold' during her time here. It is thanks to her that we achieved the highest standard for school sports.

The Red Box Project

The Red Box Project is a nationwide, community funded initiative to ensure that no young person misses school because they have their period and lack access to sanitary products.

The Red Box Project Camberley encourages individuals in the local community to get involved and donate sanitary towels, tampons and new underwear. These donations are then collected and put together into Red Boxes which are then placed into local schools. The box is accessible through an appropriate member of staff and plain bags are included in the box for discretion. Posters placed in the lavatories signpost the box, its content and location.

No tearful panics in the loo. No wadded up toilet roll. No anxious embarrassment. No missed lessons or staying at home. No missed education.

There are donation boxes at local Sainsbury's stores, Camberley and Frimley Green Libraries, The Little Gym Camberley and Mytchett Community Centre.
